

FORMER UNION RESIDENT DIES

LIQUOR CASE IS ON TODAY

The charge resulted from the finding of four quarts of liquor in Mrs. McNeely's residence some time ago during a police raid. The defendant was recently acquitted of a similar charge in the circuit court, having appealed from the city court after having been convicted and fined \$100.

Dr. A. N. Mayville represented the Moose lodge and spoke on the institution of Moschism, where Moschism orphans are cared for, and at the hour of nine o'clock the ceremony was explicated by the speaker and the Moose present. He cited the fact that some orders pattern after the Holy Writ, while others take great lessons from the annals of the forest, the Moose lodge being one of the latter.

The pastor closed the speaking program of the evening by discussing the topic from the viewpoint of the Brotherhood of Jesus. In his brief address he declared that this trait in Christ's life was one of the outstanding reasons why Christ had been able to become the pattern of men for centuries. The pastor appealed to the men present to get behind, and to support, some church.

CLAYHOLE MURDER CASE OPENS TODAY

an election later were returned against all defendants.

An agreement was reached by both democrats and republicans that they "forget" the incident in which the men were killed and wounded and that the cases be dismissed. Newspaper of the state took up the fight at this juncture and a change of venue took the case to this county of Boyd.

At the trial here last year the four democrats were found guilty and sentenced to prison for terms ranging from five to fifteen years. The nine republicans who testified against the democrats in the conspiracy charge pleaded immunity on the ground that they had incriminated themselves in their testimony. They subsequently were dismissed on the conspiracy charge.

On appeals decided by the Court of Appeals last year the sentences against the democratic defendants were reversed on the ground that the defendants were denied the right to offer testimony showing that the republicans had planned the attack on Clayhole precinct. The action of the lower court in dismissing the conspiracy charges against the nine republicans also was reversed by the Court of Appeals on the ground that the statute under which the dismissal was granted did not refer to common law offenses.
