FARM CREDITS SURE TO PASS

Compromise Measure, Embodying Features of the Former Bills, Due to Come to a Vote This Week.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27.—Farm credits legislation, over which there has been a row in congress for more than two weeks, is to be taken up in the house under plans contemplating a vote not later than Wednesday. Passage by the house was forecast by leaders who believed there would be comparatively little difficulty in adjusting the differences with the senate.

Major provisions of the two senate measures, the Lenoir-Anderson and Capper bills, are incorporated in the compromise bill as reported from the house banking committee. The formal report on the legislation was delayed but Chairman McFadden issued a statement explaining its principal purposes.
