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MOTORISTS NOW WANT MILEAGE

The motorist today buys tires with the idea of receiving a certain mileage irrespective of the kind of treatment he gives them, according to the Oregon Hardware and Implement company, the Diamond distributors here. Should his tires go over the mileage he has insured, then the tires are unusually good tires should they deliver a smaller mileage, they are unusually poor tires. The element of his own treatment and care never enters into his consideration.

OLD MEN SAY CLIMATE WORSE

TACOMA, Wash., Feb. 25.—With much cold weather, snow and ice on Puget Sound this winter, many old-timers are declaring that the climate is becoming more severe. But their memory is failing them, in the opinion of those who keep precise figures on weather conditions, and Puget Sound, if anything, is becoming warmer year by year.

One of the best reasons for the declaration that the weather is becoming warmer is that the glaciers on Mt. Rainier are slowly receding. It is known that Nisqually glacier has receded 700 feet since Lieut. A. V. Kautz of the United States army visited it in 1857 and left his mark. In 1921 this glacier retreated 100 feet, and in recent years the average recession has been fifty feet a year.

Raymond P. Tarr, local geologist, who has studied the glacier, says the annual retreat is due to warmer weather or a decline in moisture. The rainfall figures for the last 25 years indicate no diminution of moisture, so that an increase of temperature, averaging only six tenths of a degree per year, is held responsible for the melting of the great glacier.
