### Robert Chambers, Sr., Dead at Prairie City

BAKER, Mar. 5.—Robert Cham-  
bers, Sr., highly respected pioneer of  
Prairie City, died at that place Thurs-  
day morning. The death of his wife  
occurred only three months ago. The  
remains of Mr. Chambers will be  
brought to Baker this evening and  
the funeral services will be held to-  
morrow afternoon at 2 o'clock from  
the West chapel, Rev. E. T. Starkey  
officiating.

The deceased was born in Ireland  
August 5th, 1835, and at the age of  
five years went with his parents to  
Canada, where he resided until 1865.  
He then moved with his family to  
Prairie City where he made his  
home until called by death. He is sur-  
vived by one son, Robert, Jr., and a  
daughter, Mrs. G. A. Bradford.
