SHERRY'S TODAY AND TOMORROW

What many noted writers and motion picture reviewers for the daily press have declared to be one of the finest photoplays yet produced, "Hungry Hearts," a Goldwyn picture made from the volume of short stories by Anna Yoderiska dealing with New York City, is coming to the Sherry theater today for two days. It possesses in abundance the little heart interest which is the appealing element in every photoplay.

The story deals with the coming of a Russian family to America, the land of promise, where money and freedom and justice, they think, may be had for the asking. The family endures much suffering and disillusionment before finally finding that justice which they dreamed would meet them here.

The screen adaptation was made by Julien Josephson and the making of the photoplay was entrusted to Director E. Mason Hopper, the man responsible for "Hold Your Horses," "Dangerous Curve Ahead" and "It's a Great Life." He brought to bear upon "Hungry Hearts" all that sympathy for human nature and ability to see and bring out the little, humorous, heart-touching incidents which have given his previous pictures their great popularity.

The cast is headed by Bryant Washburn and Helen Ferguson. The other leading parts are taken by E. A. Warren, George Seizman, Otto Lederer, Ross Rosenova, Millie Schottland and Bert Sennott. Their acting dovetails so nicely that each seems to be living his part instead of acting it. The author has said that the picture is as good as the book and that the reason is the above mentioned fact that each player lived his part. The Russian houses, streets and yards that Claire Sheridan, the sculptress who had just come out from Russia, where she made busts of Lenin and Trotsky, and other soviet officials, upon being taken on the set while the picture was being filmed, said she had the feeling of being back in Russia. The American sets are equally realistic and the photoplays is a marvel of beauty.

BOY VIGILANTES ENFORCE THE LAW

(By Associated Press) BUFFALO, Mar. 6.—This city has a full-fledged vigilante committee with a membership of several hundred. The members do not wear masks nor do night-riding, but form a very earnest organization that believes it has a mission for better citizenship and law-observance.

The committee was formed by students of Lafayette high school after a number of boys of the institution had been arrested and convicted of stealing automobiles for joyrides. One case resulted in the slaying of a police officer who tried to arrest a trio of boys in a stolen car.

Repeated offenses by Lafayette boys, the student body and faculty decided, were giving the school a "black eye," and plans were discussed at assembly to break up the wave of lawlessness. The outcome was the vigilante committee, an oath-bound organization for law enforcement and the protection of the school name.

Offenders are brought before the Vigilantes for trial, but sentences imposed, if any, are carried out by the faculty.
