Three substitutes were put in and still the deluge of baskets continued, the first half ending 24 to 11 in favor of the locals. In the first half, with Imbler completely outnumbered, the scouts marked up 35 points to their opponents. In a preliminary game the scouts second team won from a pickup team 29 to 30. Lee McCorkle was high point man in the second game with 20 points, Fitzgerald being a close second with 18. In the preliminary game Zandall scored 22 points and Lyman 13.
