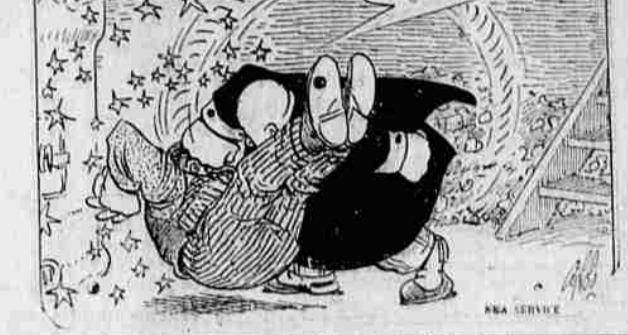

## MRS. BARRETT DIES IN OHIO

NORTH POWDER, Mar. 8.—Mrs. A. O. Barrett, sister of John M. Gilkison, of the Farmers' State bank passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. I. E. Hunt, at Bridgeport, Ohio. This is the second death in the Gilkison family within the past few weeks.

Mrs. Barrett, with her husband lived in this community about 26 years ago, leaving here for Ohio where she made her home until her death. She is survived by five children and her husband, all of whom live in Ohio, and by two brothers, Wm. Richard and John M. Gilkison, of Oregon, and two sisters, Mrs. Sarah Baker, of Baker, and Mrs. A. A few weeks ago she received word of the death of her brother, James R. Gilkison, and this being the first death in a family of six children, the shock seemed to be more than she could stand, and without appearing to be suffering from any physical ailment, took to her bed February 8, and sank rapidly, passing away February 11. Mrs. Barrett, looked one day of being 73 years of age, when death claimed her.

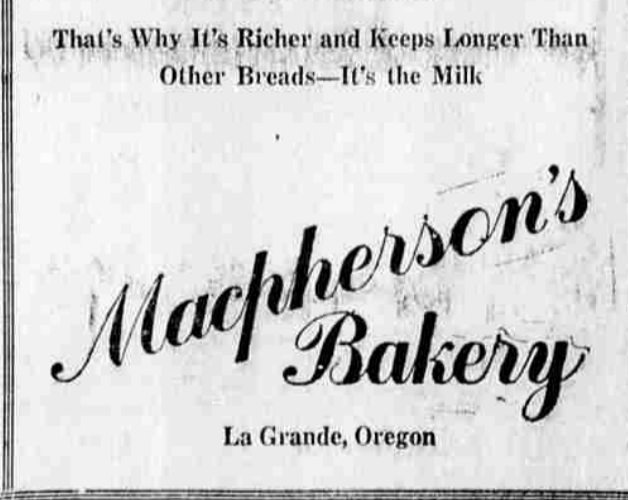
