

GOVERNORS ARE INVITED TO BE AT CONFERENCE

National Conference of Social Work Will Meet in Washington; 5,000 Delegates Expected.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Mar. 12.—Homer Parks, president of the National Conference of Social Work, today invited the governors of all the states in the union to attend the fiftieth anniversary meeting of the conference in Washington, May 16-23, and to name delegates representing their states.

The relationship between social work and public officials and government departments dealing with dependent wards of the state will be a main topic for discussion at the convention. Five thousand delegates from the United States, Canada, Europe, Cuba, Hawaii and the Philippine Islands are expected at the meeting.

A major object of the conference will be to discuss better methods of preventing disease, dependency and delinquency, in view of the fact that the number of dependent wards of the states has increased to a point where in many states about one-third of the state budget is expended on their care and maintenance.

LAMBING TIME NEARLY OVER

NORTH POWDER, Mar. 12.—The lambing season is just about over and according to reports exceptionally good luck attended the sheep men this year. The Lee & Jones herd is showing a record of about 130 per cent, as are the McPhee and the Charles Dustin herds.

At this rate the Jones & Lee camp will prove a good business despite the heavy loss sustained by them about six weeks ago. One hundred sheep were lambing every week killed when strayed by stray dogs in this city.

It is certainly gratifying to know that the sheep men in this district will be able to show a profit, not only because a few men will make some money, but because their profit means bettering the country to a very large extent, and will spur those in the game now to greater activity along these lines.

A splendid prospect is held out for high prices for sheep and wool and sheepmen are naturally elated over the situation.

Both sheep and wool buyers are in the field and offer to contract wool at a price as good and better than last year but growers are not falling over themselves to accept offers. A wool price of 45 cents per pound is anticipated. In Salt Lake last week wool sold at 47 1/2 cents.

Spring lambs are going to hit a top-notch price and there will be great demand on the part of buyers.

EXPORTS ARE INCREASING IN GREAT BRITAIN

LONDON, Feb. 21. (By Mail.)—Complete British trade returns for 1922 show substantial improvement in export trade but a decrease in imports. Exports were valued at £7,600,000,000 sterling more than in 1921, while imports were £7,000,000,000 pounds less.

During the month of December exports of coal were high, amounting to nearly 6,000,000 tons. Shipments to the United States were 17,825 tons, as compared with 209,527 tons in November. It is stated that representatives of American coal firms are now in Great Britain arranging for heavy shipments of coal during the next few months.

A further slight decline occurred in the cost of living in December. On January 1, the index figure was approximately 74 per cent, over pre-war standard, as against 80 per cent on December 1. There was a fall of

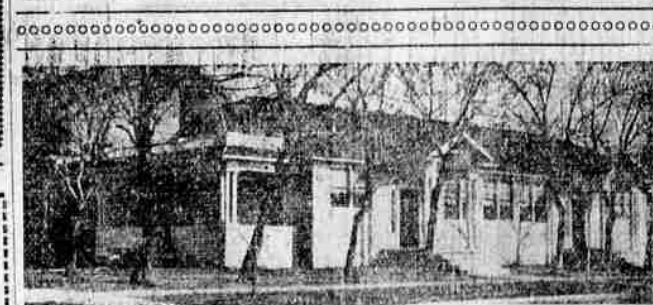

PRUNE SALES INCREASE

Portland, Ore., Mar. 12.—Seven carloads of prunes have been sold recently by the Oregon Growers' association, according to M. J. Newhouse, assistant general manager, who was here yesterday conferring with the local bankers relative to the sales policy of the organization. Prunes are moving slowly, he reports, the sales being largely due to the efforts of R. C. Paulus, manager, who is in the east consulting with buyers. One carload was shipped from the Sutherland plant today. Mr. Newhouse reports that a very comprehensive sales policy has been worked out for the disposal of the 1923 crop.
