FISH AND GAME HOGS INCREASE

California Statistics Show That Many Were Convicted of Game and Fish Law Violations.

(By Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, Mar. 14.—More than 90 per cent of the persons arrested during the last two years for alleged violation of the fish and game laws of California were convicted, according to the biennial report of the state fish and game commission.

During the biennium a large amount of illegally taken fish and game were seized. This included over 4,000 pounds of deer meat, 4,500 ducks and 500 quail, 50,000 pounds of dried fish and 24,000 pounds of shellfish. The fish and meat thus seized, wherever edible, were donated to the public and charitable institutions.

There are about 20,000 fewer fishermen than hunters in California, according to the report, licenses issued to anglers during the biennium aggregating 188,800, as against 225,000 for hunters.
