Helen Gibson, who is one of the featured players in "Nine Points of the Law," which comes to the Sherry Theatre today is one of the most proficient horsewomen in the country. Having been brought up on a horse, it is small wonder that Miss Gibson achieved fame as a rider long before she thought of becoming a screen actress.

Helen Gibson was born in Cleveland, Ohio, but while still a youngster the family moved to California, where she was raised on a big ranch. Always her father's pal, and a great friend with the "hired hands" on the ranch she was placed on a horse almost before she was able to walk.

"I don't ever remember walking," says Miss Gibson. "No matter where I wanted to go—no matter how short the distance—I always rode my horse. I just naturally came to feel more at home in the saddle than I did with my feet on the ground."

She became such a daring rider that after winning a succession of prizes in California rodeos she was induced to take up riding as a profession. For two seasons Miss Gibson was with Miller Brothers' 101 Ranch. The young woman holds many California and Pacific coast championships for rodeo riding.

It is easily understandable that when she joined the Los Angeles screen colony, directors took advantage of the fact that Miss Gibson was an expert equestrienne.

"I don't remember ever making a picture in which I have not had to ride a horse. That's one of the things about pictures which I love. It gives me an opportunity to indulge in my favorite sport even while at profession labor. It's not work to me—just pleasure."

NEW PICTURE HAS POWERFUL THEME

Evils of Publicity Shown in William De Mille's Paramount Picture.
