PIERCE FIRES HIS FAIR BOARD

campaign particularly since Reynolds,
the only member of the old board to
remain, is a strong supporter of Lee.
There was to have been a meeting
of the fair board during the early part
of the month, but this was postponed
until Saturday next at the request of
the governor.
Fred Curry, formerly of La Grande,
but now with the Modern Woodmen
of America headquarters in Portland,
and to be named secretary of the
state fair board at the Saturday meet-
ing. Curry was subsidiary to the
governor and the board members.
The board members, however, were
not satisfied with Curry's appointment.
Walker, who had refused to work
why Lee, whose resignation they had
brought about. They would have re-
sisted had Pierce insisted upon Lee's
appointment. This, it is said, led the
governor to ask for the three resigna-
tions.
It was generally understood also by
the board members, as well as by
those close to the state fair movement,
that there was to be no change in
the present personnel of the board.
This assumption caused the governor's
demand for the resignation of the
three board members to be met with
astonishment.
Bryant, in discussing the call for
his resignation today, insisted that the

board had never been as harmonious
since he had held membership upon it
as at present, and said that the only
difference of opinion that had arisen
had been between Reynolds on the one
stand and the four other members on
the other.

After Lee had resigned as secretary
of the board at the close of the last
state fair, the four members of the
board sought to secure a fiscal report
and accounting. They found that the
records had been so kept that it was
virtually impossible to have an ade-
quate audit of the books made. The
only data available being a list of the
vouchers covering disbursements of
money. It was also desired to secure
an inventory of the property held by
the board, but it was found that this
could not be procured without starting
with a survey of the land and running
from them through to the final.
Both these tasks have been awaiting
the reorganization of the board and
the election of a secretary to succeed
Lee.

In view of the situation created by
the governor's demand for resigna-
tions, it is understood that the Sat-
urday meeting will be held as sched-
uled, or postponed until the new ap-
pointments have been made and the
appointments made.
