FIELD TRIAL IS NEXT OCTOBER

Dog Event, Similar to One Held in Lebanon, Will Be Held in Eastern Oregon.

A new attraction is in store for the sportsmen of the Wing, Pin and Fleetfoot Club of Union County. Announcement has been made that a field trial, including Wallowa, Union, Yamhill and Baker county sportsmen, will be held in the coming October. "We are getting some of the best bred dogs in the United States," stated Al Andrews, secretary of the club today, "and the Wallowa county sportsmen claim the best broken dogs. This remains to be seen and the coming field trial will settle decisively the supremacy."

Lebanon, Oregon, is now on the map as far as field trials are concerned. Each fall a trial for dogs from all parts of the country is held and the interest is growing rapidly from year to year. A similar trial held in Eastern Oregon would do much to elevate the interest of the local and outside sportsmen. The club requests that all hunters owning hunting dogs join the club as the entrance of dogs for the field trial will be restricted to those owned by club members. "And we want to show Wallowa county who has the best dogs," Mr. Andrews asserted.

SPRING FOOTBALL PRACTICE STARTS

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, Calif., Mar. 22.—After a rest of three months the Stanford gridiron men will be on the job again April 3 for practice, with coaches "Pop" Warner, Andy Kerr, and "Tim" Thornhill working to develop the Cardinal backfield.

The "C" line has been weakened by the loss of Captain Dudley de Groot and Charles Johnston at center and tackle. Likewise large holes have been shot in the team by the loss of Joe Loughead, Bill Pheny and George Honick, who were stretched on off the list by the registrar's age. Craven and Paville, rated as the teams best guards, will return this spring, and Mertz, Dole, Lawson, Janssen and Thomas will be back for their places at the ends. George Baker, who substituted for De Groot in a few quarters last season, will have but one contender for the center position, Bob Hunt of the freshman squad.

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Mar. 22.—"Goat getting" golf is a form of the fairway pasture which is present about the center of interest of the Sacramento Golf club.

Each player desiring to enter the "goat" tournament obtains a medal from Secretary Frank Webster, which

on the face of the "goat" is engraved in a golf outfit and carries a bag of goats. Around the goat is raised letters in the inscription "Sacramento Golf Club" and on the reverse side is engraved the owner's name.

The matches are played by club lounge and are by match handicap. The player losing his match must forfeit his "goat" to the winner. The winner of a goat match is not required to give, in his own goal

should he lose a match to another player, but may give his opponent a goat with from a previous opponent. Thus a player's goat may change hands any number of times.

The player who has accumulated the greatest number of "goats" by the last Sunday in May will be declared the winner and will receive a prize.
