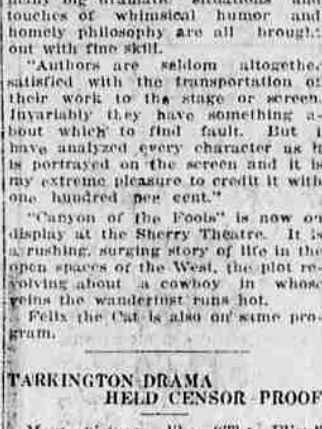

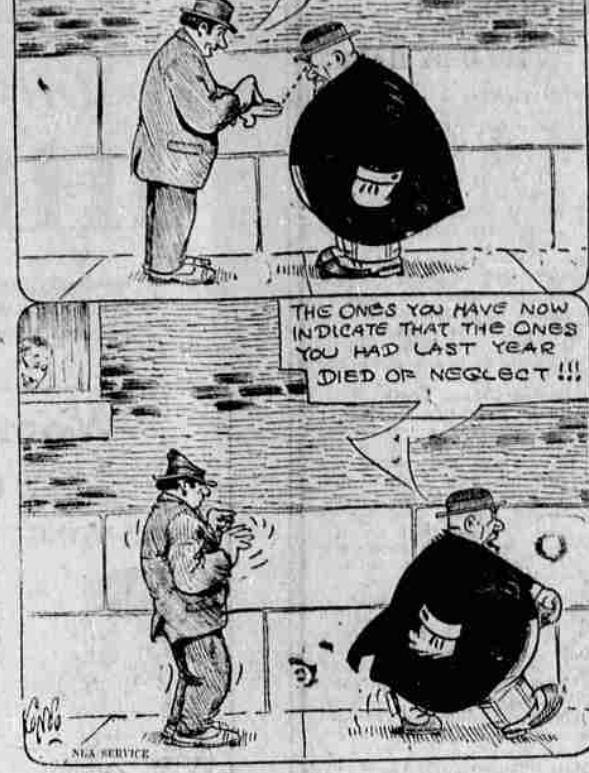

# White Man's Justice Now Invades Frozen North

DAWSON, Yukon Territory, Mar. 22.—Inspector Stuart Wood and Corporal Pastey, of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, have left Dawson for Herschel Island, one of the most arduous journeys that falls to the lot of the "mounties." The party will proceed to Fort Yukon, Alaska, thence to Rampart House. Here Inspector Wood and Corporal Pastey will leave most of their equipment and proceed on to Herschel, crossing the Arctic divide, then thru the timber limits to the Tundra, reaching their destination about the end of March. It is the longest and most dangerous of all northern trails. At Herschel Island one of the incidents of the mounted police visit will be the trial of several Eskimos under the white man's law on a charge of murder. Hitherto it has been customary to bring natives under criminal charges out to civiliza-
