human ideals. More emphasis must be placed upon the duty of obedience, more respect for the law and the application of Christianity in its broader sense if civilization is to endure. We reaffirm our sincere, devoted and unqualified support of Supt. J. A. Churchill whose tireless efforts and enthusiastic leadership and undivided support has advanced the cause of education throughout the state.

We are in favor of raising educational standards and attracting the finest ability to the teaching profession; and we stand unalterably opposed to the lowering of salary schedules for competent teachers.

We resolve that we continue to teach the essentials and that the 8th grade graduates will know how to spell, write, cipher, use good English and do good thinking.

We also recommend that every teacher follow the state course of study in teaching morals and make use of the memory games arranged by the state department of each grade.

We approve of the attempts to further the efficiency of our schools through such means as the platoon system in schools where it is evident that its adoption will result in advantages to the children and not take their time from the fundamentals.

We approve of clean athletics and urge a vigorous support of the rules and officers of the Oregon High School Athletic Association.

The question of adequate school revenues is one of the most pressing and important problems facing the country today. It is paramount that school people disclose the facts that the value received is commensurate with the actual school costs.

Resolved that a copy of these resolutions be sent to the local press and the Oregon Teachers' Monthly. We extend to the school board of La Grande, Supt. Hampton, and Principal Towler our gratitude and heart felt thanks for the use of the building during this meeting.
