FIRST PRACTICE WILL BE SUNDAY

W. C. Crews, Manager of the Pirates, Issues Call; All Urged to Turn Out.

The Pirates will get into action for the first time this year Sunday afternoon, W. C. Crews, manager of the team for this season, today issued a call for the first practice of the season to be held at the air-ground. Plans are underway to have the diamond in good shape by Sunday to permit a first class workout.

With the call for practice, came a request that everyone turn out. "No one is going to be sure of a berth on the Pirates-lineup this season," stated Crews, "every man, no matter what his past record, must show that he has got the goods this year if he is listed in the batting order. Everybody turning out will have an equal chance to make the team, dependent upon his ability as a ball player." That sounds good! No more will partially have anything to do with whether a man makes the line-up or not—ability alone is the factor. And that means that La Grande will be there with a team that is a team, for plenty of material is present this year and every bit of it will have every chance to develop. A lot of good men will be on the scene, some of whom played last year, and some who did not. Spencer, is willing to enter the league and is planning on having a team that will make any team in the league look to their laurels. Cove also wants to enter, according to Lloyd Carter. La Grande does, and it is understood that Baker is equally willing.

In addition to a manager, who has already been named, fans and players both have been talking over the proposition of having a coach, who would be on hand at every practice, superintend the practices, and arrange the line-up, etc. of course not conflicting with the captain in his duties. Several good men for the position, all of whom are former baseball players, are in La Grande—Glass, Pateck, Ed Ford, Melina and many others would be able to handle the position efficiently and the value to the team would be of a high nature.

Sportsmen Meet On Wednesday

According to Dr. Horton, the majority of sportsmen favor changing the deer hunting code to embody the killing of but one deer, buck or doe, by the hunters during the season.

Pendleton has not been heard from yet but they are expected to send a delegation and Wallowa county has signified their intentions to be on hand.

The time for the meeting has not yet been definitely set but will probably be at seven o'clock in the evening.

His opponent will be Bernie Ledou, French flyweight title champion.

Besides Criqui, five ring champions—Benny Leonard, Johnny Dundee, Frankie Genaro, Mickey Walker and Joe Lynch—are slated to appear, while Pancho Villa, a former American flyweight titleholder, and Luis Firpo, South American heavyweight, also are on the program.

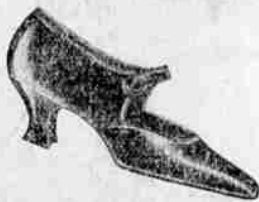
