TWO DAYS OF SPORT PLANNED BY SPORTSMEN

Delegates from Four Counties Met Here Last Night; Changes in Game Laws Recommended.

Representatives from four Eastern Oregon counties, Baker, Umatilla, Wallawa and Union gathered in H. K. O'Brien's offices at the conclusion of a banquet held in the Foley Grill at seven o'clock, and made recommendations for changes in the state game and fish regulations and discussed the dog field trials.

A positive conclusion was agreed upon in connection with the proposed field trial. A committee, consisting of Blaine Hallock, of Baker, Al Andrews, of La Grande, and Marion Jack, of Pendleton, was appointed to make arrangements for the formation of a sportsmen club to embrace all Eastern Oregon counties, twelve in number, that will govern the field trials.

Two Days of Sport. The tentative plan, as advanced last evening, is to have two days of sport, which will include a dog field trial, a fly-casting contest and shooting contests, the affair to take place in La Grande sometime in July.

The sportsmen club will be officially formed early in June, possibly in connection with the Wing Fin and Fleetfoot fish meet.

Many Recommendations. Many changes in the state game and fish laws were recommended last evening, the recommendations to be forwarded to the State Game and Fish Commission for consideration. Changes in the deer law, and the closing of Beaver Creek, Five Point creek and Ladd creek for one year, were among those of prominence.

The latter recommendation was made due to the fact that the streams in question are practically fished out and it is impossible to properly restock them without an intervening time to allow an interference on the part of fishermen. It was urged that Wallowa river, above Wallowa lake, for a length of about two miles, be permanently closed in order to prevent fishermen from invading the spawning beds.

Recommendations were also made that the grouse law be changed making the season coincide with the deer season and an eight day pheasant season. Umatilla county urged that they be given an open season on Hungarian partridges corresponding with the one on pheasants. Several other recommendations were made which will be quoted in full at a later date.

LUIS FIRPO WINS FROM JIM HIBBARD

NEW YORK, Mar. 28.—Luis Angel Firpo, South American heavyweight, and conqueror of Bill Brown, won the decision over Jim Hibbard of Buffalo, in a four-round exhibition bout for the benefit of the American committee for devastated France Wednesday night.

Firpo showed much speed and decided improvement in boxing. Although the boxers wore eight-ounce gloves, Hibbard, a newcomer in the heavyweight class, was badly battered at the end of the bout. The Argentinian did not uncover the full power of his punches.

Jack Britton, former welterweight champion, and Elio Flores, Filipino boxer, went through four rounds of milling to a draw.

Frankie Genaro, American flyweight champion, won handily from Bobby Doyle of New York in their four-round exhibition, while Johnny Dundee, junior lightweight champion, captured the decision from Tony Vaccarello of New York in four frames. Eight other bouts were held, all staged under the direction of Miss Anne Morgan, chairman of the committee.

been turned loose in various parts of the country within a few years by the game commission and sportsmen's associations. Birds from these flocks have made themselves at home with legbara chickens in several instances.

With this year's hatching, three hybrids which have every evidence of being crosses between the leghorns and the Chinese pheasants, appeared. The birds live about the ranches, but are so wild as to be unapproachable. With the rapid breeding qualities of the leghorns and the laws by which genetic birds are protected, rapid development of the breed is anticipated.
