SEMI-FINAL GO EXCITING MANY

Six-Round Event Between Charlie Weise and Baron DeGreeve Creating Much Interest.

Second in interest only to the main ten round event between Freddie Hart of Los Angeles, and Lee Morrissy, of Idaho Falls, is the six-round semi-final between Baron DeGreeve and Charlie Weise, of La Grande, the two matches heading the boxing card to be held at the Star Theatre on Tuesday night.

Local interest in the match is at top height and guesses as to who will be winner are about evenly numbered among the fans of La Grande. Both boys come in the water stage and both can fight. DeGreeve has not appeared in the ring here but is reported to be in training for the event and in prime condition. Those who have seen him work out maintain that he has a punch resembling "F. N. T." and knows his stuff in other respects.

Weise, who has appeared in the ring in La Grande for about one minute, is physically nearly perfect and boxed in the navy considerably during past years. His first appearance here was against Johnny Natto, of whom he made short work, knocking Natto to a row of singing bottles in less than a minute, four punches doing the work. He looks mighty good to his followers and they are confident that he will bring a lot of credit on DeGreeve. But that isn't worrying the latter's proponents, who anticipate no reprieve in their corner.

Matches between local boys are always a great drawing card to the ringsters and they are unanimous in expecting the semi-windup to be as thrilling as the final mill. Manager Ed Paul has announced that Harry Hewitt vs. Cleo Clapp and Kid Davis vs. Frank Hartman will make up the two preliminary four-round events. Tickets for the card are on sale at the Imperial and at the Home Plate.
