**Reported Improving**—Mrs. Hollenbeck, who underwent a surgical operation this morning, is reported to be recovering from the operation very successfully.

**Passes Through La Grande**—Highway Commissioner Dudy, of Baker, passed through La Grande this morning on his return from Portland where he attended a meeting of the highway commission.

**Marriage License Issued**—Marriage licenses were issued from the county clerk's office this week to Clarence A. Witty and Ruth Leona Miller, of Elgin, March 27th, and to Calvin E. Reynolds and Parra Brown, of La Grande, March 28th.

**Former Mayor Here**—E. C. Gettings, former mayor of Elgin, is in La Grande today transacting business. The visitor is owner of the City Garage at Elgin and one of the leading business men of that city.

**Occupies New Home**—The Rev. H. Bogstad, pastor of the Zion Lutheran church, and his family, are now occupying the parsonage which the congregation has provided for them. The Lutheran parsonage is located at 903 M avenue, opposite the high school.

**Improving Ice Plant**—Le W. Weeks, insurance agent and proprietor of the Crescent Market on Fir street, is making extensive improvements in the ice plant, located at this market, this week. The plant is being renovated and improved, and Mr. Weeks expects that it will, when completed, be one of the finest of its kind in La Grande.

**Attend Board Meeting**—J. E. Reynolds, prominent La Grande resident, left this morning bound for Portland and Salem. He will attend the meeting of the State Fair Board at Salem tomorrow, representing Eastern Oregon. Mr. Reynolds was the only former member of the board to be reappointed this year by Governor Pierce.

**Former Baker Pastor Resigns**—The Rev. Ward McHenry, formerly pastor of the Presbyterian church in this city and who enjoyed the esteem of the people generally, has resigned his pastorate of the Mount Taber Presbyterian church, much to the surprise and regret of his congregation. His resignation is to take effect September 1. His future plans are not announced.

**The Rev. Mr. McHenry Resigns**—The Rev. Mr. McHenry resigned the ministry because he felt that the duty which he agreed to assume when he went to Mount Taber six years ago had been completed. Besides wiping out a \$11,000 debt, he has spent \$2,500 in improvement—Baker Herald.

**Miss Bollman's Father Dead**—Friends of Miss Bollman, secretary to Governor Pierce, have received word that her father passed on in Tacoma Saturday evening at the age of 78 years. Miss Bollman immediately went to her parent's home on receipt of the word. While it is not stated where the remains were buried it is thought that interment took place in Eugene, the former home of the Bollmans.

**Crawford in Portland**—"We've had this sort of weather for several days," declared Judge Thomas Crawford of La Grande at the Imperial yesterday. The judge, who is one of the rock-ribbed democrats of Oregon, was the manager of the personal campaign of his tillicum, Walter M. Pierce, for governor. The first official appointment that Governor Pierce made was to appoint Judge Crawford to the board of regents of the Oregon Agricultural college, the vacancy in the board being caused by Mr. Pierce's election, he having been on the board. Judge Crawford was particularly delighted with the appointment, as he is one of the early-day graduates of the college. Judge Crawford left yesterday afternoon for Corvallis to attend a meeting—Oregonian.

## NO MORE FEES FOR TWO YEARS

PENDELTON, Mar. 30.—Decision has been made by the forestry service to postpone action on the setting of new fees for grazing on the national forests for two years, on account of lack of completed tabulated information on a recent survey of all forests. This decision is very favorable to local stockmen, who recently made strong protests against any increase in grazing fees.

Cattlemen and sheepmen entered a united protest against any increase in the charge, on account of the poor condition of their industry, and the cattlemen contended that if there was any increase that it would be the straw in their financial difficulties.

Practically all of the grazing permits for the Umatilla national forest have been issued, the preference going to former allottees.

Snow is fast melting on the Blue mountains and is now about one month ahead of the snow movement of last season, according to Forest Ranger George Brace who has a station just above Bingham Springs and who is now in the city.

The snow is entirely gone about the river and on the south slopes and there is only left in sheltered places. The spring grass for grazing on the forest is just starting to grow," stated Brace.

Prospects are fair for the spring range but the summer range is still under a cover of snow away back in the mountains.

BRENOS AIRES, Mar. 30.—There is a strong probability that Argentina will be represented at the international Olympic games next year in Paris. President Alvear in a recent interview declared himself to be much in favor of the idea and has promised his support.
