

STRAYER TELLS OF INCOME TAX

Value of Measure Is Lauded
By Senator W. H. Strayer
In Speech at Baker.

With many views pro and con being presented on the income tax bill passed by the Thirty-second legislature, the following report of a speech by Senator Strayer before the Baker Chamber of Commerce as printed in the Baker Democrat proves of much interest.

"High and low lights of the legislature" was the subject dealt upon at the chamber of commerce luncheon at the Gaiser grill at noon yesterday by W. H. Strayer, state senator from Baker county, in a manner which pleased all who heard him. The recent session of the state legislature, body was referred to by the senator as "uncle's history" but he stated that it was a necessary evil because of the adversity of civilization and the changing opinions which necessitate changes in the laws. The speaker pointed out that the accomplishment of the legislature were under proportion due to the "prejudice and poison, always present, finding manifestation in the fruits of the work." The largest measure of good works, despite the fact that it is always hard to appreciate anything of a negative character, was in the prevention of the writing on the statute books of certain legislation. Mr. Strayer stated: "That the income tax measure, although it may embody some of flaws is a fair, conservative and real means of redistributing some of the burden of taxation resting on the agricultural interests of the state who are demanding immediate relief was the opinion expressed by the senator and he added that if the present law is killed by the people, a "measure with real teeth" has already been practically drawn for submission to the next session of the legislature. Mr. Strayer also touched upon the work of the ways and means committee on appropriations and lauded the act which he stated will place the state prison on a self supporting basis, thereby saving the taxpayers of the state \$450,000.

That income tax dodger who filed his way out of jail probably will file a return next time.

ESKIMOS SAY GHOSTS REVEL

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, Mar. 31.—Some natives of Alaska profess to believe that the angry spirits of the Aleuts massacred at the behest of the early Russian discoverers and traders under Shelikoff, Baranoff and Chirikoff, are lurking in the volcanoes of the Valley of Ten Thousand Smokes.

Beneath the thin crust of the earth covering the lower Alaskan peninsula and the Aleutian archipelago, these spirits, the natives assert, are holding nightly revels and emerging periodically to hurl fire, smoke and thunder at the heads of the invaders.

The fanciful recital of the natives is that on Chirikoff island, long famed as haunted, a half hundred natives were lured into a log compound, set upon by savage enemies under direction of the Russians, murdered and despoiled of priceless sea otter skins. Their spirits are appearing again in protest. The eruption of three volcanoes in January is, they say, a visitation of these spirits, and will continue until they are avenged.

For many years Chirikoff island has been a place seldom inhabited by natives or whites. Many harrowing tales from Chirikoff were brought

Walla Walla Railroad Trying \$1 a Week Plan

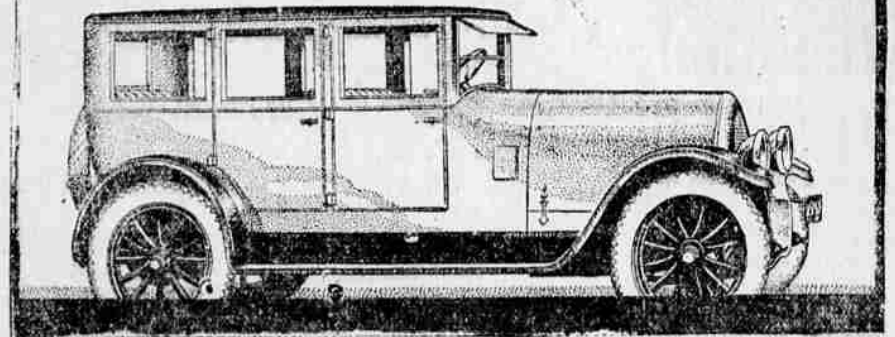
WALLA WALLA, Mar. 31.—Startling Monday, March 26, for a ninety-day period, the Walla Walla Valley
