Series of Rifle Matches To Be Held By Marines

WASHINGTON, April 2.—Marine Corps riflemen will soon test their skill in a series of rifle matches to be held at stations in the United States and West Indies. These contests are preliminary events leading to the selection of the best Marine Corps rifle shots who will compete in forthcoming state and national matches.

Beginning May 7 the best Marine Corps riflemen in the West Indies will gather at Guantanamo, Cuba, for the first meet. This is to be followed by rifle matches at Mare Island, Calif., a Marine Corps training station on the West Coast, May 21. Other matches are scheduled to take place at Parris Island, S. C., the East Coast training station, May 23, and the final match of the preliminary season will end at Quantico, Va., about June 15. Orders recently issued by Major General Lejeune, Commandant of the Marine Corps, authorizes the holding of the matches in which several medals and trophies will be awarded. From among the winners a team will be chosen to represent the Marine Corps during 1935.
