**BROCCOLI DEMAND GOLD** ROSEBURG, Apr. 6.—Early predictions on broccoli shipments will be far surpassed before the season is over, a summary of the situation to date shows. Including today's shipments more than 250 carloads have been sent from the Umpqua valley and it is expected that at least 50 more will be moved. The harvest is 80 per cent complete, it is estimated. During the last few days about 20 carloads have been moved daily, one exchange having had three shifts working day and night.

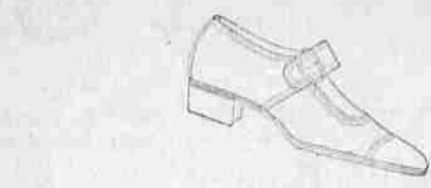

PAVING OBJECTED TO VANCOUVER, Wash., Apr. 6.—A warning that insistence by the city council that the North Coast Power company repave Twenty-sixth street, would probably mean the removal of the tracks from the street and ultimate surrender of the company's franchise, was contained in a letter from R. M. Boykin, manager of the company's holdings, which was presented to the council last night. Mr. Boykin held that, since the car system here has been a constant loss to the North Coast Power company, the officers would never stand for the additional \$30,000 loss, which he estimates would be the cost of repaving between the car tracks along the street in accordance with city specifications.
