SHERRY'S LAST DAY.
 That sparkling dynamic of ever-
 changing emotions—modern Woman
 is revealed in all her strength and
 weakness by Daniel Carson Good-

 It is a big theme upon which this
 powerfully dramatic subject is found-
 ed. It deals not merely with individ-
 uals. Mr. Goodman, who wrote and
 also produced it, goes beyond the lit-

 way and makes of it a true canvas
