TURKS WILLING TO TALK PEACE

LONDON, April 9.—A Ruter dispatch from Constantinople says the Turkish reply to the allied not proposals that the Lausanne conference convene April 22.

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 9.—The (By Associated Press)
reply of the Turkish government to the invitation of the allies for Turkey to attend the session of the Near East peace conference, to be resumed soon at Lausanne, reached Constantinople Sunday from Ankara and will be immediately conveyed to the representatives of the allies here.

The note declares the Turkish counter-proposal contain no substantial modifications of the territorial and other clauses of the draft treaty which the powers cannot equitably accept. It suggests certain reservations on economic and financial questions and on the capitulations clauses of the treaty.
