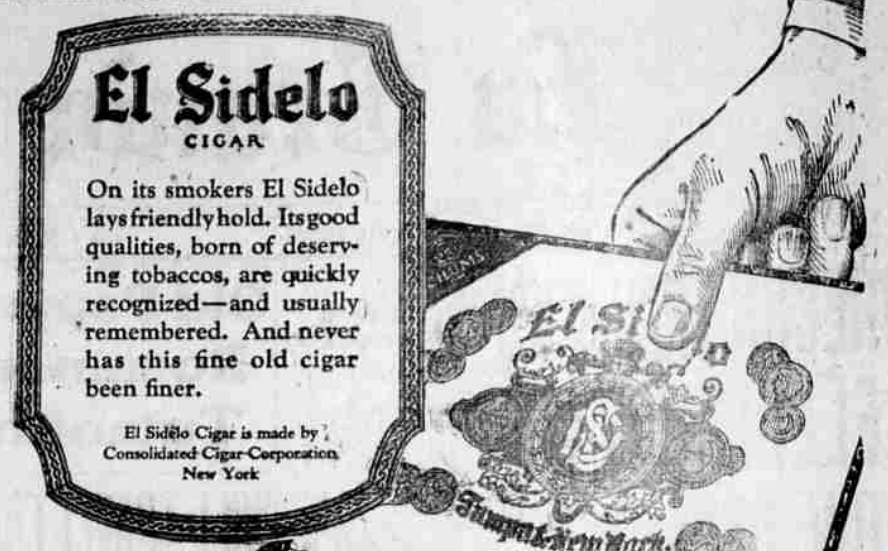

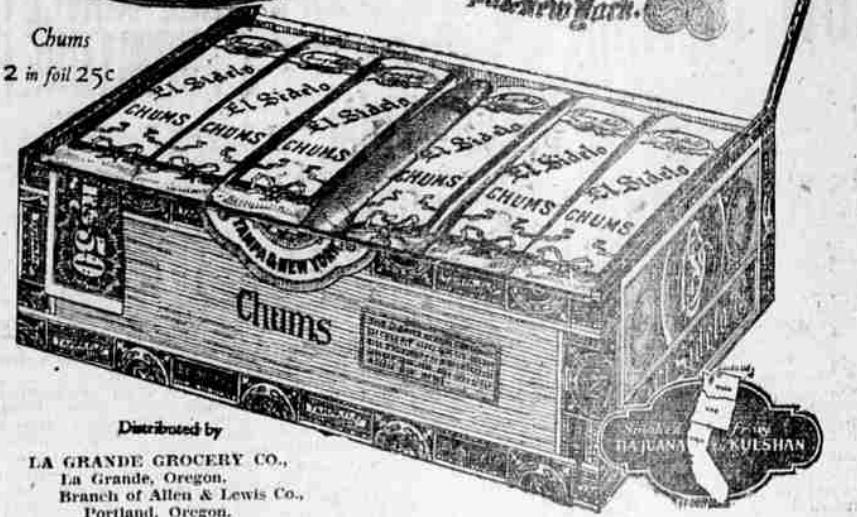

Gingerbread

2 cups Olympic Flour, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 3 teaspoons ginger, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 cup molasses, 1/2 cup milk (sweet or sour), 1 egg, 3/4 cup shortening. Mix and sift dry ingredients. Put molasses and shortening into a sauce pan and heat slowly until shortening is melted and mixed with molasses. Beat egg, add milk, then molasses mixture and dry ingredients. Bake in well-greased shallow pan or muffin tins in moderate oven twenty-five minutes. Gingerbread is greatly improved by adding the grated rind of an orange to the batter before baking. One-third cup chopped walnuts or raisins may be added also.
