JUNIORS WIN BY 1 POINT MARGIN

Interclass Meet Decided By Relay; Seniors are Ousted From Top By Juniors; The Final Score was Juniors 68, Seniors 67.

In one of the most interesting interclass track meets that have been held for several years here, the Junior class yesterday emerged victors by a margin of but one point. The final score stood as follows: Juniors 68, Seniors 67, Sophomores 11, Freshmen 8.

Throughout the meet both the upper classes ran neck and neck in the scoring, the Juniors taking an early lead. The contest was not decided until the midpoint, when the Seniors went several laps behind in the relay. Seniors led by four points, but lost the meet by losing the last event. Considerable strength was shown by several of this year's men. Larson, 1 mile high hurdles and Price in the 250-yard dash, made the best proportional time in the track events and Larson, winner of the 400-yard dash, 250-yard dash and the javelin, was second with a total 19.14. Lynch was third high point man with 15.34.

Larson High Point Man
The Larson, Senior, was high point man of the day with a total of 34, over half of the total number scored by the Seniors. He placed first in the 100-yard dash, the 120 high hurdles, the 250 yard low hurdles, the shot put and the discus and took second in the broad jump, the 250 yard dash and the javelin. Price, winner of the 400-yard dash, the 250-yard dash and the javelin, was second with a total 19.14. Lynch was third high point man with 15.34.

Captain Clark Price showed up exceptionally well in the sprints yesterday, losing the 100-yard dash by a half foot, winning the 250-yard dash over Larson, the favorite, and again beating Larson in the final quarter of the half mile relay.

NEW BASKETBALL RULING IS MADE

NEW YORK, Apr. 12.—New rules governing basketball, the most important one eliminating the specialized foul shooting, were adopted Wednesday at a meeting of the joint basketball rules committee, attended by representatives of the Amateur Athletic Union, the National Collegiate Athletic Association and the Young Men's Christian Association.

The rule affecting the specialized foul shooter prescribed that when a personal foul is called against a player, the man against whom the foul is called must take the free throw.

Technical fouls are to be shot by any member of the team. During the past season when a personal foul was committed within the goal zone, two fouls were called regardless of whether the man had possession of the ball. The new rule states that two free throws will only be granted when the player has the ball in his possession within the goal zone, or when the player is in the act of shooting for a basket outside of the goal zone.

USE OF COMMERCIAL FERTILIZER

Sparsely and often is the best motto to hang up in connection with the use of commercial fertilizers, particularly those strong in nitrogen, light sprinklings used in every two weeks will prove more effective than heavier dressings which furnish more food than the plants can use.

Nitrate of soda, one of the most effective and quickest acting fertilizers, should be used very sparingly at each application. It should not touch the leaves of the plants, as it will burn them. It is best applied when the soil is moist. It should be powdered finely by smushing the lumps before it is distributed over the surface of the soil. It is the great encourager of plant growth and in the early spring is very effective on asparagus beds.

Bone meal is a slow acting fertilizer and one of the most permanent. Some of its fertilizing property is utilized quickly but the remainder in the ground and decays it furnishes a constant supply for at least a year. It cannot burn the plants and is one of the safest and best of the commercial types of fertilizer to use.

Balanced fertilizers are described by a code indicating of three numbers separated by hyphens, such as for example, 2-11-1, and 5-8-4. The first number is the percentage of nitrogen or ammonia contained in the mixture; the second, the percentage of phosphorus; and the third the percentage of potash. These are the three chief elements of fertilizer.
