Dual Meet Will be Close

Baker and La Grande High School Track Teams Are To Meet Here Saturday Afternoon.

La Grande's high school track and field team will take its second step in the spring interscholastic season Saturday afternoon when they will take on the Baker high school team at the fairgrounds, in a dual contest. Baker, as yet an unknown quantity, is rated as strong and La Grande fans feel that the meet will be a true criterion from which to figure strength of the local athletes.

Whether the meet will go to the Baker county lads or to the Blue and White team, one thing is certain—the score will be close. Enough is known of Baker's strength to draw the conclusion that they have a formidable aggregation—apparently well balanced, that will make the local boys exert themselves to the limit in every stunt, from the 100 yard dash to the final relay.

From the showing against Union Saturday, La Grande can be listed as strong in the sprints, the hurdles, the 440 yard dash, the shotput, discus and fairly well balanced in the remaining events. La Grande has yet to develop a finished form in the relay although she has the sprinters to put it across in fast time.

As plans now stand, the meet will start promptly at two o'clock, the 100 yard dash the first event on the track events and the pole vault leading the field program. A competent list of officials have been secured for the event and fans are assured that the meet will not drag, but will shift rapidly from event to event, letting the interest remain at a high point. Points will be counted for only three places, first, 5; pointer, second, 3; points, and third, 1 point.
