Baker-Blues Meet Saturday

At two o'clock tomorrow afternoon, if the weather is anything but an absolutely prohibitive downpour, the starters pistol will crack—and the starters of Baker and La Grande high schools will leave their marks for the first event in the program of the day—the 100 yard dash.

The two schools, friendly enemies for many decades, will again meet in a dual contest to decide who is supreme on the track and field at the fairgrounds Saturday afternoon. As matters stand at present La Grande has the edge on the Baker county seat boys for the 1922-23 season. Blue and White gridiron artists unmercifully drubbed the Baker boys 22 to 6 in the fall and in the basketball season, the two schools have even, leaving La Grande the margin.

Baker, known to have a strong team, is anxious to humiliate the local athletes and needless to say, the home boys are anxious that that doesn't happen.
