I. W. W. STRIKE ON MAY FIRST

Governor Pierce Will Act if
Laws are Violated; Walk-
out Plans Said Perfect.

(By Associated Press)
SALEM, Apr. 23.—What action, if any, will be taken by Governor Pierce in case the threatened strike of the Industrial Workers of the World materializes May 1 has not yet been determined, the executive announced today.

The governor has received a number of letters from Klammath Falls and other sections of the state saying members of the radical organization have perfected plans for their walk-out. It was said that demonstrations will be attempted May 1 in some parts of the state.

One letter received from Klammath Falls indicated that radical literature has been in circulation there for several weeks and that practically 100 per cent of the Industrial Workers have signified their intention of participating in the walkout. Logging and milling operators have not yet issued any statements with relation to the proposed strike beyond indicating that they will close down their industries before they will accept the declaration of the radical element.

Governor Pierce apparently has assumed the attitude that his department cannot act until there has been some infraction of the laws. In case the laws are violated then the governor probably will use all the machinery at his command to cope with the situation. The executive has indicated that he will not permit destruction of the industries of the state.

Probably the first step that will be taken by the governor in case of a strike will be to advise the state board of conciliation of the situation, and urge the members of this body to conduct an investigation with a view to settlement. Should this investigation call the governor probably would resort to more drastic action.

Reports received at the executive department indicate that the industrial workers apparently have no grievance with reference to wages or hours, but are basing their proposed strike on the theory that they have been made the victims of capitalist greed. Operators have declared the men are now receiving satisfactory wages, are working under good conditions, and the hours have been shortened to meet their demands.

Governor Pierce said today that he hoped the men involved would at least make an effort to settle their differences through arbitration. Many mills in the state have resumed operations within the past few weeks and labor disturbances now would affect materially the prosperity of this section of the coast.

And she left for me a tiny envelope to be given me when I was older. In it a tiny lock of soft brown hair tied with a silk thread. The hair was cut from my head when a tiny baby and a folded paper with these lines written by my mother:

MY TREASURE
O would you see my treasure,
It's guarded with zealous care;
Its value I will not mention
It's a treasure rich and rare.

It's hidden away from prying eyes,
(With none my treasure I'd share)
And if I to you my treasure reveal
To touch it, you must not dare.

And now, my friend, look quickly and see
This treasure I've kept with care;
Tied neatly up with silken thread
Why, it's only a curl of hair.

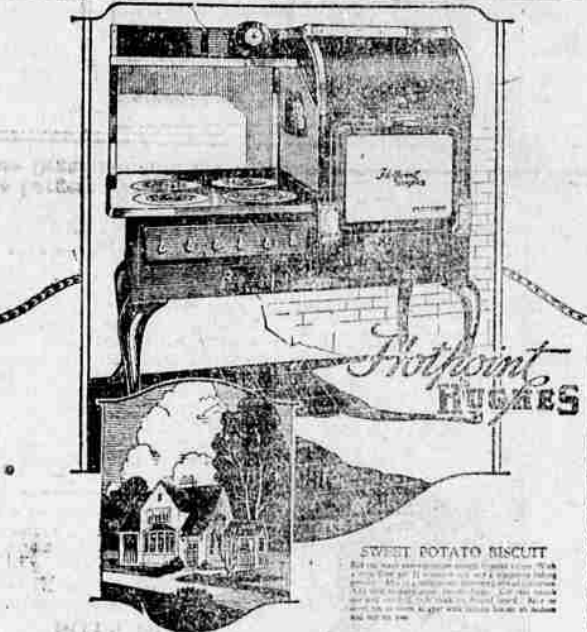
