Subscriptions Being Sought—For the purpose of constructing a new road into East Eagle on the survey completed last fall by the forestry service several subscription lists are being circulated and are meeting with the best of success. "DEAD LETTER" MAIL IS LIGHTER

Education of the proper way in addressing and mailing letters and parcels is one of the causes of the decrease in dead-letter mail, it was learned at the postoffice today. The stream of dead letter mail has been steadily decreasing during the past few months until now only a small handful of dead letters is being despatched from the local office each week.

Very few persons nowadays fail to place their return address on letters and most of the mail sent to Washington is for persons leaving the city without forwarding address or letters addressed to the wrong town.

Advertisement classes have also helped much in educating the foreigner in the correct ways of addressing mail and whatever other mistakes the alien may make he seldom neglects to place his return address on the back of the letter. There is a great deal of correspondence between the foreigners in this country and the greatest error is made in their spelling the name of the town the way it sounds to them.

Frequently it is not the poorly educated persons who overlook the requirements but it is often the business and professional men and women.

THREE GOVERNORS INVITED

ASHLAND, Ore., Apr. 26.—Governors of three states have been invited to attend a big military day celebration here June 13, at which time 400 of the Oregon coast artillery soldiers will be the guests of the chamber of commerce while en route to the summer training camp in California. Governor Pierce of Oregon has accepted the invitation, while replies have not yet been received from Governor Richardson of California and Governor Hart of Washington.

Following the arrival of the special train bearing the guardsmen to the south at 10 o'clock a parade and review on East Main street will be held with the three governors and Adjutant-General George A. White in the reviewing stand. An athletic drill, featuring the new army exercises, which will be staged by the Marshfield organization, while contests for trophies between members of the various units will be held.

At noon a dinner will be served to the soldiers, members of the Grand Army of the Republic, Spanish War Veterans and the American Legion, this to be held in Lithia park. Speeches will be given in the park during the afternoon before the troops depart at 4:30.

THE HOME GARDEN

What is Home without a Garden?

THE MAN WITH THE HOE SAYS
Great improvement in the old-fashioned lupines and their use by florists as cut flowers has again popularized this plant for summer bedding. Where the perennial types do not flourish often the annual kinds will furnish a beautiful display of color as well as fine spikes of their peashaped fragrant bloom for cutting.

Lupines must have plenty of moisture. It is useless to plant them in dry or sandy soil where they will be thoroughly cooked by the summer sun. They prefer a little shade.

As now developed, there are a large number of colors in the annual strains ranging from blues and scarlets to whites with the blooms tipped with white.

These annuals are not largely grown but are well worth a trial. If they will flourish, they give a great show of bloom. Gardeners with a fairly moist soil will find them very attractive additions to their plantings.

Watch the ventilation of cold frames and hotbeds as the first warm days approach. You may save a lot of plants or kill them when the weather gets warmer. Sprinkle in the evening before such is closed.

Give the nasturtium beds a nitrate dressing. About a pound and a half to a square rod. Also salt them if you want to keep down the weeds and make the "grass" tender.

April is the last month to get heliotrope and dusty miller started from seed for summer bedding. One plant costs as much as a big packet of seed.

Modern scientists now tell us the old-timers weren't so far wrong about the moon influencing garden truck. But do not bother about it. Get the seed in when the soil will fall off the fork.

You can "slip" any pansies that kept over winter if you want a stock of them. Take the shoots from the roots and put them in wet sand in a sunny window.
