Blues Downed By Bucks Team At Pendleton

Larson High Point Man of Meet With 16 Markers; Final Score Was 88 1/2 to 33 1/2.

La Grande high school athletes, easy winners over Union and Baker, met their Waterloo last Saturday afternoon at Pendleton, losing the dual track and field event by the score of 88 1/2 to 33 1/2.

The meet began at one o'clock and the first event ran off, the 100 yard dash, gave Pendleton 5 points. Stonebraker, Whitman, and McGee, all of Pendleton, took the three places, Stonebraker winning in 19 1/5 seconds. The time would not hold place in a record however, as Stonebraker, according to Pendleton papers, beat the gun.

Larson High Point Man. La Grande had one stellar performer Saturday in Eric Larson, who by winning first place in the shot put and the high hurdles and second in the low hurdles and dimes, placed high point man of the meet with a total of 16 points. Newton, of Pendleton, was second with 14, and Ernie, Stonebraker and Lattie, of Pendleton, tied for third with 12 points each. La Grande's scoring, excepting Larson, was as follows: Smith 3, Price 4, Steinbeck 3, Zimmerman 1, Funk 1, Garrick 3, Lynch 2, and Jacobson 1.

Pendleton walked away with the relay in the last time of 1:35:2-5 seconds.
