Editors Adopt Code.
WASHINGTON, Apr. 29.-The American Society of Newspaper Editors at its closing session adopted a "canon of journalism," covering the ethical standards of the profession and the aspirations of American newspapers.

Decency in News.
"Seventh-Decency-A newspaper cannot escape continuation of insincerity if, while professing high moral purpose, it supplies incentive to base conduct, such as are to be found in details of crime and vice, publication of which is not demonstrable for the general good. Lacking authority to enforce its canons, the journalist here represented can but express the hope that deliberate pandering to vicious instincts will encounter effective public disapproval or yield to the influence of a preponderant professional condemnation."
