## Opener to Be Gala Affair

### Baker Making Plans for Big Dedication of New Park; Pirates' Line-Up Is to Be Augmented.

Baker is planning on making the opening game of the Inter-mountain Baseball League, to be played in the Union City's new baseball park next Monday, a gala event, according to reports received here today. On that day the La Grande Pirates will journey to Baker and Union will play the Couvo team.

Preparations are being made in Baker to care for a large crowd of ball fans, both from La Grande and Baker, and reports also state that Baker is expecting to put a high class team in the field this year. Traveling the weather is good, it is hoped that a large number of La Grande fans will accompany their team to Baker Sunday.

That the Pirates will present a strong lineup is a certainty. In addition to the number that is eagerly seeking a position, Manager Treva states that three men will be added to the squad before the opening game. They will be Bud and Tex Knight, infielders, and McGee, pitcher, all of whom are said to be in first rate form and ready to go in mid-season shape.

## Fugate Not to Fight Bairie

Several changes are being made in the final and special events on the boxing card scheduled for Thursday evening in the Star theater.

Motomby, Ed Ford today stated that Johnny Fugate of Portland, would not appear against Bairie in the main event, and Mr. Ford is looking for another opponent for the local lad.

Harris of Penelton, matched against Kid Sarp, in a round special event, has broken his hand, according to reports, and will not be able to meet the local batter. In his place has been secured Mike De Pinto of Portland, rated as one of the clearest men in his class on the coast. The Pinto will weigh about 120 or 130 and should put up an excellent fight against Sarp.

That a real feather-pusher to meet Bairie will be secured was promised by Mr. Ford.

## DEMPSEY SIGNS TO MEET TOM GIBBONS

(By Associated Press) CHICAGO, May 1.—Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight boxing champion, will defend his title against Tommy Gibbons, St. Paul challenger, at Shelby, Mont., on July 4 in a 15-round to a decision contest. Loy J. Mohr, state commissioner of the Montana American Legion, announced Monday night. Mohr said that an agreement was reached Monday night over long distance telephone with Jack Kearns, Dempsey's manager.

All that remains to be done, Mohr said, is to sign the articles and to select the referee. A dozen of the most prominent referees in the country have been discussed, he said.

Articles of agreement will be signed Wednesday or Thursday in either New York or Chicago, Mohr indicated.

Dempsey will meet Gibbons two years after he last defended his crown, defeating Georges Carpentier at Jersey City July 2, 1921. Shelby, Mont., the site of the encounter, will provide a much different experience for Dempsey than the scenes of his previous fights since becoming champion. It is a town of less than 1000 persons, located in the midst of the Montana oil fields.

## BRUINS ARE READY FOR EASTERN MEET

(By Associated Press) BERKELEY, Calif., May 1.—When the University of California track and field squads defeated Stanford University on April 21, the Bruins vindicated their decision to go west on May 26-27 for the forty-seventh annual championship games of the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America, according to Coach, Walter Christie of the Bruins.

Originally both the I. C. A. A. A. meet to be held in Philadelphia or at Cambridge, Mass., and the Pacific Coast Conference, to be held at Pullman, Wash., were scheduled for May 26. The University of California voted to send its squad west in an effort to win the third straight meet, thereby arousing excitement among the western colleges.

However, the Pullman meet has now been postponed until June 2, and the Bruins' track and field men will participate in the I. C. A. A. meet in the east and hop back to Washington, arriving the day before the western finale. Washington State, Willamette, Montana, Pacific, Idaho, Willamette, Washington, Oregon, Oregon Aerie, Stanford, Southern California, and California are expected to take part in the Pacific conference meet.
