"LORNA DOONE" AT ARCADE THURSDAY

Heralded by critics throughout the country as Maurice Tourneur's "greatest masterpiece" and a "thrilling dramatic spectacle of unrivaled beauty," "Lorna Doone" will open at the Arcade theatre on Thursday. Tourneur's fictionalization of Blackmore's famous novel has attracted world-wide attention and for once the critics have forgotten to complain that "the picture is nothing like the book." While the novel has been decidedly condensed in the film version, all the main dramatic episodes which have made the book a "best-seller" for three generations have been retained and the spirit of the times has been faithfully reproduced.

For the fan unfamiliar with the novel, "Lorna Doone" offers an evening of exciting entertainment for the love story works out to a triumphant ending only after tremendous conflicts in which life itself is at stake. A spectacular fight in which one man matches his wits against the strength of a whole band of outlaws and the burning of the "boon" village after a bloody battle are "thrillers" that would satisfy anyone.

To the book lover, the student of the coming of "Lorna Doone" will be a rare treat. Tourneur has earned a reputation as an educator in the film industry and his screen versions of classical books and plays have been marked by such artistry that they have won permanent places in the film libraries of schools, churches and community houses.

Critics declare that "Lorna Doone" far outstrips even "Treasure Island" and "The Bluebird" which won Tourneur such acclaim. Massive sets, marvellously staged pageants, realistic fights and picturesque costumes have been combined with the lavish hand of a producer who spares no expense to obtain desired effects. The royal baptism scene in Whitehall (Chapel of Westminster Abbey) is said to be one of the most beautiful spectacles ever shown.

Madge Bellamy, endeared to the public by her splendid work in Thomas H. Ince's "Half the Woman" plays the title role. With her beauty and undeniable charm, she should be ideal in the part of the gentle "captivity maid of Exmoor," John Bowers, one of the biggest men physically of the screen, has been appropriately cast for the role of "John Ridd," Lorna's lover who was the strongest man in Devonshire. Frank Kravich plays the great old outlaw chief, "Sir Ennoor Doone" with Donald MacDonald as the villainous "Carver Doone," who meets such a horrible death in a quagmire.

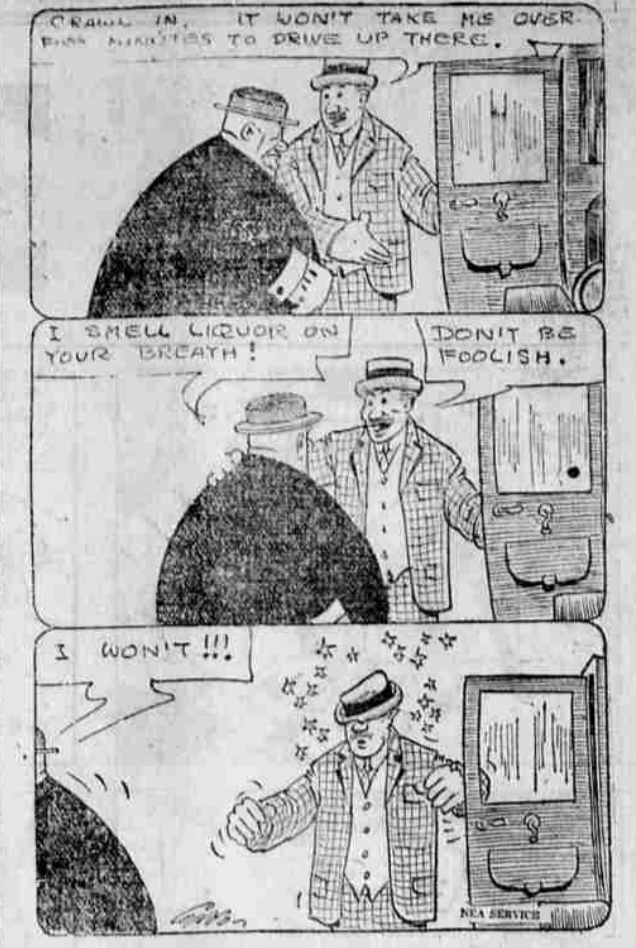
BRASS THIEVES ACTIVE
