TIRE AND TUBE SHIPMENT HERE

The first large shipment of tires and tubes from the Columbia Tire corporation, an Oregon tire manufacturing concern located at Portland, has been received, states Harold French, manager of the local branch. The shipment consists of all standard sizes of both tires and tubes.

The Portland factory is now turning out 100 tires daily, although the plant was placed in operation only a short time ago.
