## Paddock is Star

PALM, May 7.—France Sunday was declared the winner of the international students' athletic meet, held at the new Ponce De Leon stadium, in which athletes representing colleges and universities of 12 other countries competed. The French students collected a total of 197 points as against 80 for Italy and 76 for Canada-Slovakia.

Charles Paddock, California sprinter, was the only American competitor. By all odds he was the individual star of the meet. During the four days of his participation he broke one world's sprinting record and equaled four other records three of them his own. In addition he recorded broken or equalled during the last week. Paddock Sunday equaled his own record in the 100 and 200 meter dashes, negotiating the distance respectively in 19.2-2 and 29.1-2 seconds. In an exhibition race Paddock equaled his 100-yard dash record—9.2-4.

**THIRTY CARPENTERS QUIT SCHOOL JOB**  
PORTLAND, May 5.—Thirty union carpenters quit work at new Grant high school last night because of a dispute over their wages. They are to replace the union laborers who struck when their demands for \$6 a day were not met. The contractors offered \$5.50. The pay was \$5.10 a day.

Possibility of the incident spreading into a general strike of the building trades craft is seen in the latest development.  
J. J. Neal, president of the Building Construction Employees' association, declared this morning that the matter was not one for the Association to interfere with now. The latter organization, composed of architects, contractors, craftsmen and others having to do with building yesterday proposed a conciliation committee for settling the trouble.  
"I told a committee from the Association of Building and Construction in work here that we were willing to arbitrate," said Neal. "It was \$5.00 a day, representing the Building Trades' council, declared that there was nothing to arbitrate."

**CHECK PINE RESOURCES**  
BOISE, Ida, May 7.—An expedition of Idaho's white pine timber resources will be conducted during July by Governor C. C. Moody, who the chief executive personally will lead an expedition through the forest districts in the northern part of the state. The purpose of the investigation, it was announced, is to determine what portions of Idaho's timber holdings can be sold at that time and also to decide on precautionary measures to save the forests from fire.

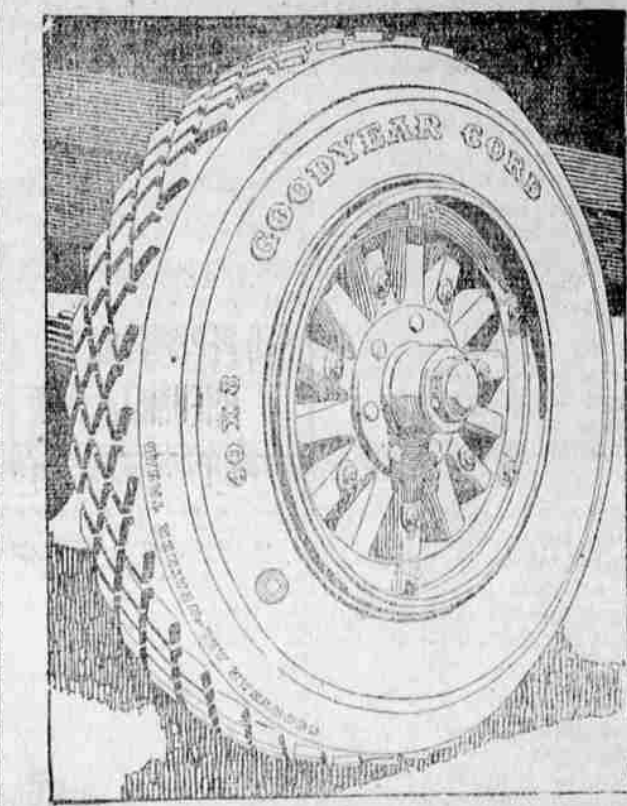
