One of the most unusual characterizations of the year is that of Lon Cheney in "Shadows," a preferred picture. Cheney in this appears as Yen Sin, a Chinaman who is cast on a New England coast by a storm at sea and who later is instrumental in bringing happiness to two people who beretried him.

Cheney's make-up and Oriental mannerisms in this picture will make a decided impression on the minds of movie patrons. The high point of the picture, when Yen Sin denounces Nat Snow in the presence of John Malden, will get over with a decided bang. It is one of those scenes that linger long in the memory.

The cast is unusually good. Aside from Cheney there are Marguerite De La Motte, Harrison Ford, John Sainpolis, Walter Long, Buddy Messinger and Frisco. Honors all of whom do good work. The photography is exquisite. Considerable technical skill is seen in the storm sequences which serve to introduce Yen Sin to the austere New England villagers. 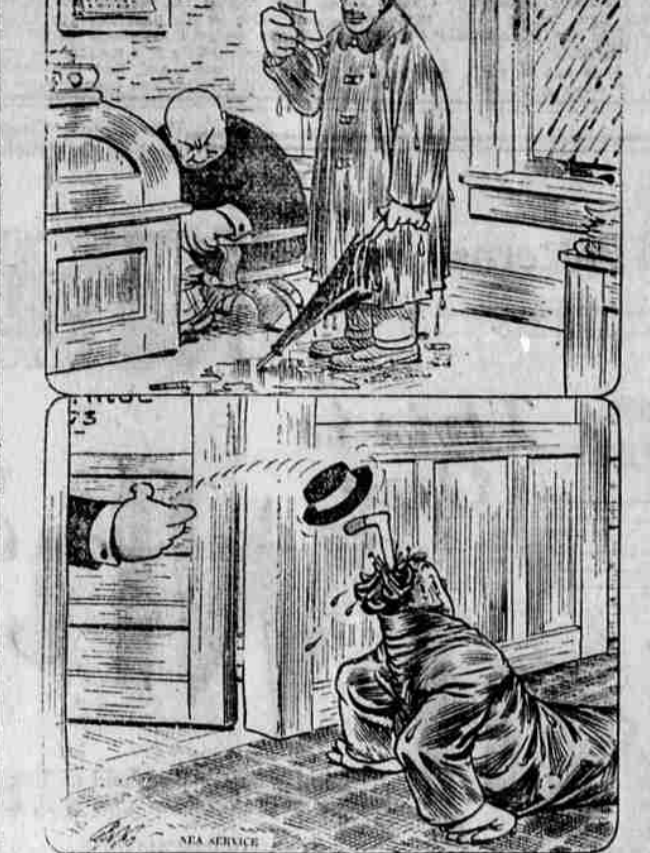
