

DOVE OF PEACE MISSION FAILS

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, May 7.—Standing before the bar of justice in the courtroom of Judge J. A. Iverson here recently, A. L. Mickelsen impatiently awaited the sentence about to be pronounced upon him for violation of the prohibition law. As the judge was about to speak, spectators were startled to see a white dove fly through an open window, encircle the room and suddenly alight on a desk near the prisoner.

The proceedings halted, but only momentarily, and whatever the mission of the dove it did not serve to make peace between the court and the defendant. After the hubbub among the spectators subsided, Judge Iverson continued with the proceedings and meted out to Mickelsen a fine of \$250 and a ninety-day sentence.

The dove tarried in the courtroom for a short time, then departed.

BOUNDARY PERMIT ORDER IS LIFTED

CALIFORNIA, Calif., May 7.—Assurance has been received here from Washington that a recent order of the treasury department requiring the issuance of a new permit for automobiles upon each crossing of the international boundary will be suspended so far as it affects this port. If enforced, the order would seriously interfere with industrial operations in Lower California, carried on chiefly by American interests. Thousands of machines daily travel back and forth across the Mexican line here, and it is estimated that a force of fifty men could not handle the filling out of permits called for in the new ruling.

COUNTERFEIT MEN HAVE LOST SKILL

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, May 7.—Although counterfeiting is on the increase the general workmanship on counterfeit notes is inferior and not so difficult to detect, according to W. T. Moran, chief of the United States

secret service who was in Salt Lake City recently.

"The inferiority of counterfeit notes," Mr. Moran said, "is largely due to the use of new photo-mechanical processes which for the most part are being handled by amateurs. Years ago, before these processes came into use, the operations required much skill."

There is not so much counterfeiting of coins now, according to Mr.

Moran. This, he said, was due to the fact that during the war the prices of metals soared and it still high enough to make this production unprofitable.

While note raising and check forging has caused the secret service much trouble in the past few years, Mr. Moran declared not much money had been realized in this manner because raised notes and had checks are so easily detected and suppressed.

Philippine Legislature Is To Have New Home Soon

MANILA, April 9. (By Mail).—The Philippine legislature will have a new home in 1924, according to the director of public works. At present the senate meets in an old building in the Walled City while the house sessions are held in the Ayuntamiento building one block away, which

is owned by the city of Manila.

The new building on Taft avenue, which will be used by both houses of the legislature, was originally intended for the Philippine library, but it was decided the legislative bodies were in greater need of new quarters than the library.

The new structure, which is more than half completed, will be four stories high. The second floor will be occupied by the house of representatives, the third by the senate, the fourth by offices and committee rooms and the first by clerks. The building when completed will have cost approximately \$1,800,000.
