Pendleton Is Given Edge in E.O. Contest

Warm weather, and ideal conditions are rounding the time and while track and field team into excellent shape for the Eastern Oregon track meet to be held Saturday afternoon at Baker, Oregon.

A list of trophies, partially complete, has been made public and includes the following: Silver loving cup for the winning relay team, provided by the Basse-Sage Hardware company of Baker; a silver loving cup for the winning school in the entire meet, provided by Palmer brothers of Baker; and a silver loving cup for the winner of the 880 yard run provided by Dr. W. M. Peare of La Grande, a gold medal for high point man, and medals for first, second, third and fourth places in each event.

Tom Gibbons Posts His Bond for Championship Battle With Dempsey

CHICAGO, May 8.—With the posting of a \$25,000 forfeit, Eddie Kane, manager of Tom Gibbons, St. Paul heavyweight, Monday fulfilled the challenger's contract binding a championship match with Jack Dempsey at Shelby, Mont., on July 4.

Kane plans to leave for St. Paul Tuesday to complete details preliminary to Gibbons' departure for the training camp. He hopes to engage Billie Miske, the St. Paul heavyweight, as one of Gibbons' sparring partners. Miske fought Dempsey twice, and knows his style and Kane figures he will be of valuable assistance.

Gibbons will leave on a barnstorming trip through the west, meeting all corners in all important towns in Utah, Montana and the Dakotas. He expects to be settled in training camp not later than May 17. It is possible that he may train at Billings, Mont., as he has received an invitation to establish camp there.

Dempsey will do his training at Great Falls. Mike Collins, matchmaker for the Montana promoter, let Monday night for Minneapolis, en route to Shelby, to superintend the construction of an arena seating 30,000 and costing \$50,000. Work will be started on the arena Wednesday, Collins said and the contractors have assured him of its completion within a month.

Dempsey said he will again start training in earnest for his bout with Tom Gibbons on July 4 at Shelby, Mont.
