Seattle Labor Body Is Asked To Drop Soviet Views By A. F. of L.

WASHINGTON, May 10.—The Central Labor union of Seattle was notified Wednesday by the executive council of the American Federation of Labor that it must either rescind its endorsement of soviet rule in Russia or discontinue its affiliation with the federation.

Demand also was made that the Seattle union cease referring communications from the American Federation of Labor to a subordinate committee on political action and that it "comport itself in accordance with the policies and principles" of the federation.

Action with reference to the Seattle body follows similar demands, it was announced by the federation, on the Minneapolis Trades and Labor assembly, which, it was said, accepted the conditions laid down.
