## PIERCE STANDS BY THE INCOME TAX MEASURE

 great motherhood in the Mastaba range.  
 Share Tax With Counties.  
 "Then let us be fair and give one-fourth of that severance tax to the counties in which the timber is situated, one-fourth to the reforestation fund to reforest the cut-over lands for all the state and for future generations, and employ one-half of the severance tax to reduce the state burden."  
 "There are counties in this state that have bonded themselves heavily. There are ports and school districts that have bonded themselves heavily, with the life of bonds running longer than the life of the timber that is now being cut. And the rate of cutting is going to increase and not diminish. Timber will be gone. The bonds still will be there on city and school districts, leaving the farmer, the milkman and the other producers steeped in debt to pay the obligations that should be paid while the timber is still here."  
 Indirect Revenue Favored.  
 "If it were in my power I would raise all the money for the maintenance of state government from indirect sources. There is plenty of burden for property to bear to pay the city taxes and the county taxes

and let the burden of state government be met by those fortunate enough to have net incomes, by a tax on natural resources and a gross earnings tax upon public service corporations.




