### INCOME TAX INDORSED

THE DALLES, May 17.—Indorsement of the income tax bill, as passed by the last session of the legislature, and adoption of a resolution condemning the referendum of the bill, were results of a meeting of the Wasco County Farmers' Union, held at Nausens, it was announced today. The stand of Governor Piers on the "oleo" bill and his successful effort to avert a referendum on the gasoline tax law, were indorsed by Farmers' union members.

A resolution was adopted asking that highway and road work be temporarily suspended, in order that a sufficient number of ranch hands be made available for harvesting fruit and grain crops. C. E. Spence, newly appointed state market master, addressed the assemblage on the subject of farm legislation and the duties of his office.

### SNOW LEAVING RAPIDLY

MEDFORD, May 17.—Charles G. Thompson, new superintendent of Crater national park, who returned from the reserve today, said that he expected automobiles would be able to drive to the rims of Crater lake by June 20.

This was Mr. Thompson's first visit to the park. He went in and returned on skis. Mr. Thompson said that when he left, the snow at the rim was less than 6 feet deep and at Anna Spring camp less than 4 feet.
