RAIL TOLL FOR MONDAY FIFTEEN

Five Die in Franklin, Ohio, Truck-Train Wreck; Big Wreck in Portugal Fatal to Six; Snowslide Kills 4.

FRANKLIN, O., May 22.—Five members of the household of Bert Williams met death and another man was probably fatally injured late Monday at Carriale, near here, when a passenger train crashed into a truck which was moving the Williams family from Franklin to a new home in Germantown.

The injured: Jess Gross, 56, driver of the truck, brought to his home, internal injuries; expected to die. Selen Kindred, 59, bruised and cut. The two women and three children were seated on a sofa on the rear of the truck, which was loaded with furniture.

Six Die in Train Wreck. LISBON, Portugal, May 22.—Six persons were killed and 39 others injured, most of them seriously, in an

accident to a descending train on the cog-wheel railway on Mount Bon Jesus, near Braga, Monday.

DENVER, May 22.—A gigantic snowslide sweeping down the mountainside at a terrific rate of speed struck the west end of Tunnel No. 32 on the Denver & Salt Lake railroad between Coynia and Diale Lake, Colo., late Monday—killing four members of a working party and injuring two others.

The dead: Thomas J. Thom, Pete Zarkoff; Alfred Anderson, John P. Stewart, John Thompson, foreman of the party, and William P. Pierce, were injured. The men were working on the top of the shed, clearing it of snow. The slide started high on the mountain side and engulfed the men before they could escape.

ROAD POST TO BE FILED

SALEM, Ore., May 22.—Appointment of a state highway commissioner to succeed Robert A. Booth of Eugene probably will be announced by Governor Pierce this week, according to a statement made by attaches of the executive department today.

It was said that the contest has narrowed down to two men. These include Wade Malone of Corvallis and J. E. Norton of Marshfield. Mr. Malone formerly served as county judge of Benton county, is a practical road builder and has a large number of endorsements from various sections of southern Oregon. Mr. Norton is a banker and has the endorsement of Charles Hall and a number of other men prominent in the last campaign.

BULLETIN ON REVENUE OUT

PORTLAND, Ore., May 21.—"As a material step in promoting co-operation between the government and taxpayers, Commissioner of Internal Revenue David H. Blair has inaugurated a new program in the issuance of the internal revenue bulletin, which contains decisions and rulings on various tax and prohibition questions," announced Clyde G. Huntley, collector of internal revenue, today.

"The internal revenue bulletin now is issued weekly, presenting to taxpayers the latest rulings and opinions of the attorney general, solicitor of internal revenue, and treasury decisions, dealing with income, sales, capital-stock, tobacco, oleomargarine

and miscellaneous taxes. In addition, the bulletin contains a great fund of information on tax and prohibition matters.

"Supplementing the weekly bulletin, the internal revenue bulletin service consists of a quarterly digest, which will contain, briefed but retaining their full import, the rulings previously published in the weekly bulletin, and semi-cumulative bulletins in which will appear in full all new rulings, decisions, etc., published during the preceding six months. The semi-annual bulletins will be issued in July and January.

"The promptness with which tax information now is made available to the public will greatly enhance the value of the bulletin service. The weekly bulletin will be issued each Monday. To assure the widest and most expeditious distribution, Commissioner Blair has ordered that subscribers on the Pacific Coast and all points west of the Mississippi be given preference in the mailing of the bulletin.

"The internal revenue bulletin service now has more than 29,000 subscribers, and under the new plan of Commissioner Blair it is expected the subscription list will be doubled.

"Information concerning the service, which is furnished on a subscription basis, may be obtained from the bureau of internal revenue, or superintendents of public documents, government printing office, Washington, D. C."
