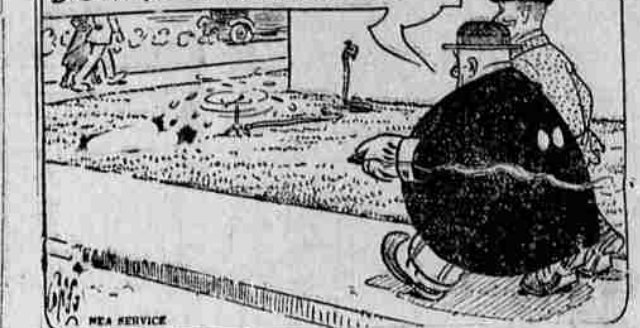
STUDENTS SELECT CHIEF
