## 2 CONCERNS IN NEW QUARTERS

**Snodgrass Grocery and Macpherson's Bakery Retail Establishments Now Have Splendid Housings.**

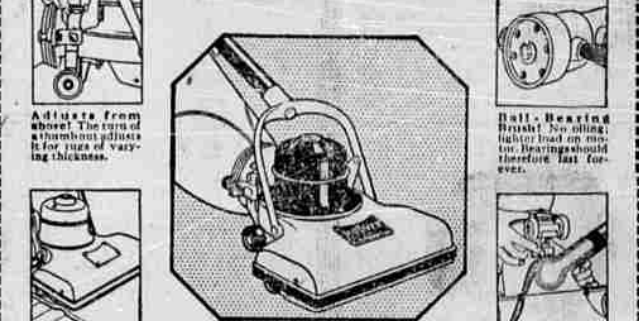
