GOMPERS SCOUTS ALLEGED SCARCITY OF STEEL WORKERS

WASHINGTON, May 26.—Commenting on the report of the American Iron and Steel Institute favoring the maintenance of a twelve hour day in the steel industry, President Gompers, of the American Federation of Labor, declared it indicated the intention to sacrifice steel workers to the interest of prices and profits.

He scouted the assertion of labor scarcity and declared that the steel industry could obtain needed workers if it paid sufficient wages.

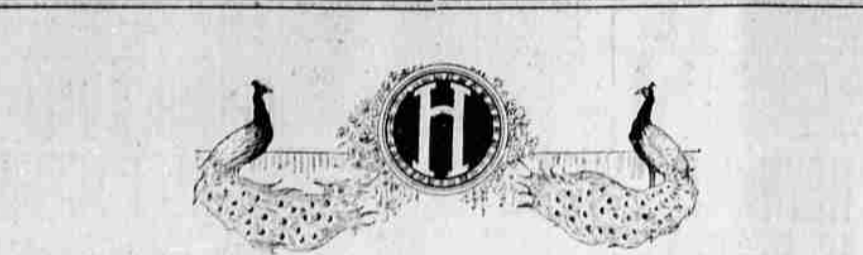
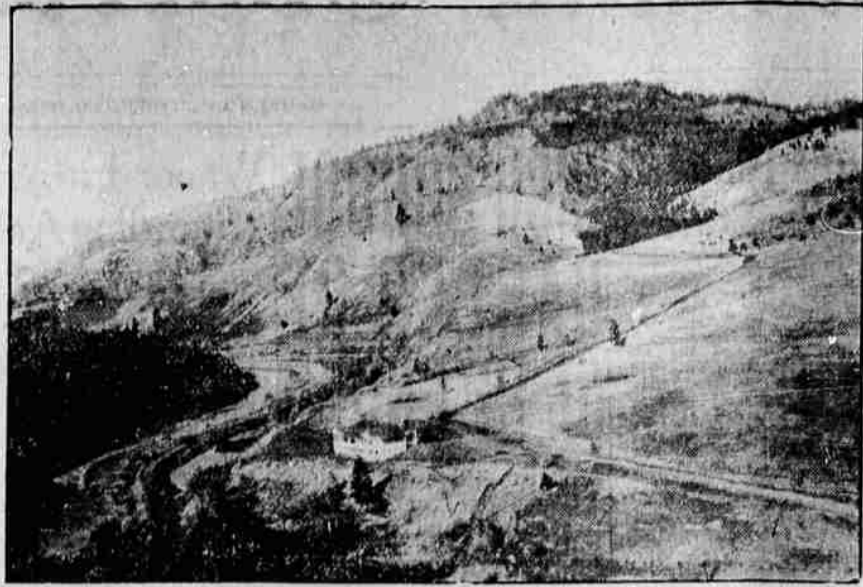
