Kenneth Vanorder has been on the sick list for a few days with a cold, but he is up and around again.

Archie Vanorder was here from Big Creek last week.

Samuel came in that John Wallace was doing exceedingly well on his new fruit ranch at Corvallis, Ore.

Elmer Swedger and family are on the Hall ranch running a large dairy. They are having from 50 to 60 gallons of milk at a milking, for a starter, which will be much more in the near future, as it is the intention of both him and Mr. Hall to increase the herd and the fresh cows are coming in quite fast.

Guy McNair has purchased the old Haggerty place, and has installed a dairy. He has from 12 to 20 cows. In addition to running his farm and dairy, Mr. McNair has the position of the sheriff, generally from June 1 till October 1.

It is the intention of the 13 subscribers on the telephone line, farm line No. 1, to have a meeting in the near future, organizing and formulating plans for the management of the line, especially for the purpose of securing a lineman who will keep the line in repair, as it needs general repair work all along, having caused much trouble last winter.

Paul Ellis, forest ranger, of Cove, in company with another ranger from Baker, were up on Catherine creek looking after the several allotments given to sheep and cattle ranges. Mr. Ellis reports seeing many deer tracks, some elk signs, and a fresh bear track up on Little Elk creek, two miles above the Park.

They went up as far as the trail crossing above the Middle Fork, returning by the north side crossing Elk creek, following the national forest reserve line, then crossing, going north at the head of Irene creek, north of Hunter's big log cabin.

Steve Hutchinson, with a number of men took a bunch of cattle from Union, turning them out on the Whitman forest reserve above the Park.

The rangers report that the grasses up near the big mountains are not started very heavy as yet. This is to be expected, as the snows are not melted down enough to let the grass shoot up as in the previous years.

Rapid progress is made with the surveying of the proposed railroad up Catherine creek. Surveyors are in evidence nearly following the highway, up to the Hall ranch, a distance of 10 miles from Union. The first stretch of the work will be, it is reported, from Union to the Smith ranch, near the summit between Union and Medical Springs. Activities are kept very quiet, but it is believed that a road is coming in the near future. Nearly all the timber holders in the vicinity have optioned their properties with the Standard and Davis firm, alleged promoters of the deal at Union.
