## GRADE CROSSING IS AUTHORIZED

In the matter of the application of the State of Oregon, through its State Highway commission, for an order permitting and authorizing a grade crossing over the tracks at the O-W. R. & N. company's railroad at Wynne siding, Walla Walla county, the Public Service commission of Oregon, ordered that the application of the highway commission on file be granted in accordance with the terms and provisions of the findings, which are given below:

That the subject matter of this hearing is within the jurisdiction of this commission;

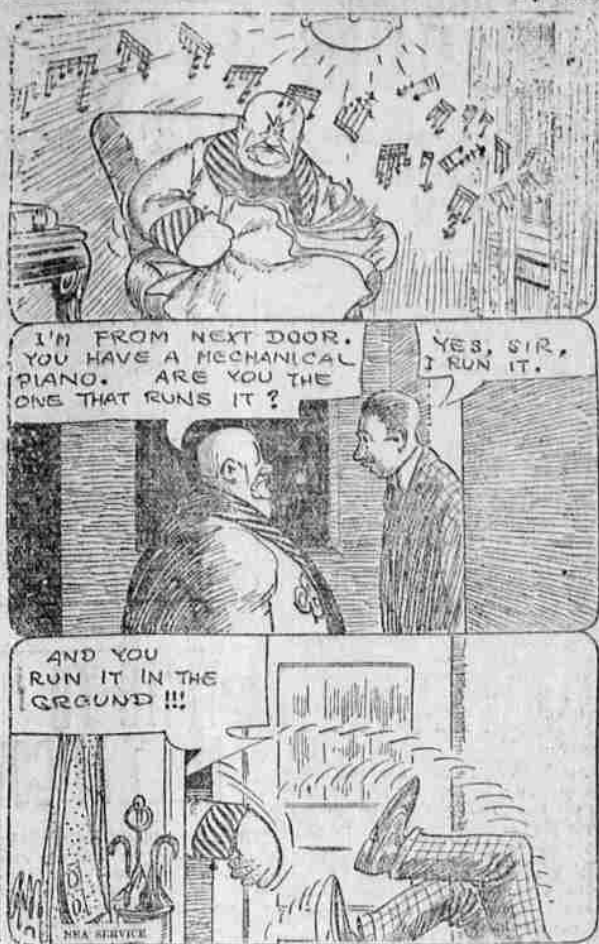
That the application of the Oregon State Highway commission for authority to construct a crossing at grade over the tracks of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company at Railroad Engineer Station 2704 plus 60, more commonly known as Wynne Siding, should be granted;

That said crossing should be constructed in a good workmanlike manner in accordance with the blue print plans on file herein, which are by this reference made a part hereof; that said crossing should be plankbed between the rails and for a distance of eighteen inches on either side thereof, the planking to be flush with the top of the rail; that the approaches leading to said crossing from both directions should be easy of ascent and descent; and that said crossing shall be equipped with winged fences, cattle guards, crossing signs and advance warning signs of the usual standard and design;

That the three present existing grade crossings, located at Railroad Engineer Station 2561 plus 44, 2595 plus 11.6, and 2704 plus 60 respec-

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tively, shall be closed, fenced up and abandoned immediately upon the completion and dedication of crossing herein above referred to;

That private crossing located at Railroad Engineer Station 2559 plus 80, more commonly known as the Wade Crossing, shall be established and maintained as an open public crossing;

That said crossing located at Railroad Engineer Station 2569 plus 80, shall be constructed and maintained in accordance with the usual Highway commission's standards as is more particularly set out in finding No. 3 hereof.

That the investigations of the commission show that any crossing other than at grade at the points designated herein would be impractical and prohibitively expensive;

That the cost of the construction, maintenance and abandonment of the crossings herein mentioned shall be borne as follows:

The cost of constructing and maintaining that portion of said crossings between the rails and for a distance of eighteen inches on either side thereof together with the cost of installing and maintaining crossing signs, cattle guards and winged fences shall be borne by the railroad company. The balance of the cost of the construction, maintenance and abandonment of said crossings shall be borne by Oregon State Highway commission.
