SHERRY'S TO DAY & TO MORROW

There are few people both young and old who have never read this American classic by Washington Irving. It has been a timeless tale for a century. Realizing this fact, Carl Stearns Caney, producer, made every effort to present in the film every point of interest that is found in the story. The filming of this production was made upon the exact locale as the story in the wooded and hilly section of New York state which is still known as Sleepy Hollow.

One of the most interesting points of the picture is the showing of the graveyard in which the "Headless Horseman" or "The Galloping Horseman" as he was known in olden times, was buried. In this graveyard, which dates back many years, rests the remains of many of the most prominent people of Washington Irving's time.

Another historical value that can be found in this production is "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow" is the exact church where Ichabod Crane sank. This church is now just the same as it was during the life of Ichabod Crane and shows just how the church service was held by the old Dutch settlers.

While the schoolhouse in which Ichabod Crane taught had been torn down, the history of this community was carefully searched until Producer Caney found the exact replica of the palace of instruction ruled over by the inimitable Ichabod. He built a schoolhouse with every detail imaginable upon the site as that shown in the story by Washington Irving.

The old Sleepy Hollow Inn is also shown and the stage coach, which was the only means of travel to those days, has been reproduced with infinite care. The home of the wealthy Dutch Van Tassel in this picture version is one of the oldest homes in this section of the country and it is said was inhabited during the trying times of "The Headless Horseman."
