

# APACHE STATE GREET'S BIRDS

(By Associated Press)  
**TUCSON, Ariz., June 6.**—Not all of Arizona's visitors are human beings. Professor Charles S. Vorhies, entomologist at the University of Arizona, is authority for the statement that Arizona is on the yearly visiting list of 129 species of migratory birds. Of these, fifty-seven species spend the winter here, while seventy-two prefer the hot months of summer.

Approximately 100 other species of the aerial tourists are transient guests. Some of these, en route to winter or summer homes elsewhere, stop here for a visit of courtesy; others, aimless wanderers of the bird world, appear infrequently and for no particular reason.

Perhaps the most interesting of these winged visitors are the water species, most frequently near Yuma. Professor Vorhies attributes the appearance of these inhabitants of the water in a region where desert conditions predominate to the proximity of the state to the Pacific coast and the Gulf of Mexico.

# CUSTER SCOUT BODIES FOUND

**MILES CITY, Mont., June 6.**—An incident in the taming of the west, a fight with the Sioux on the banks of the Yellowstone river, west of the mouth of the Tongue river, was brought to light here recently for the first time, according to a statement made by G. R. Morris, of Great Falls, Mont.

The story was brought to light by James and Patrick McEvoy, of Calabar, when they stated they had knowledge of two graves of white men, killed there in the early days by hostile Indians. None of the oldest pioneers, including the McEvoy's, who have lived here more than forty years, knew the identity of the men.

Mr. Morris, who was a scout under General Custer and General Stanley during their expedition in 1873, after hearing of the story of the unknown dead, said:

"When I was a scout with Custer and Stanley in 1873, we had a fight with Sioux Indians on the north side of the Yellowstone river, across and in the bottom above the mouth of the Tongue river. In the fight the veteran army surgeon, Dr. Halsinger, of Custer's cavalry, and Sutler, were killed and the bodies were buried. Mules trampled over the graves obliterating traces of burial. This was done to keep the Indians from scalping the men. These must have been the bodies found. My partner, Charles Reynolds, and I saw them killed."


