## Episcopal Church

Simple Answers to Common Questions About the Church (To Be Continued)

**Do Not Church People Put the Church Before Christ?**  
 It is not easy to see how this can be done, inasmuch as the Church is the Body of which Christ is the Head, and Bride of Whom He is the Bridegroom. When accused of putting the Church before Christ, we are only insisting on the truth of some of Christ's words, or on the importance of some of His institutions which others pass over or underestimate.

**What is Meant by "Apostolic Succession?"**  
 It simply means this: That the Apostles' office did not die with the least of the Twelve Apostles; but was carried on by the laying on of hands, so that the Apostolate should never cease in the Church. Our bishops are the direct successors of the Apostles. The Bible says that upon the death of Judas and Apostles elected Matthias to take his "ministry and Apostleship," setting an example which the church has followed ever since.

**Are You Interested in Sunday Schools?**  
 Always and forever. Her Missionary Magazine stands today at the head of missionary periodicals for interest. The Episcopal church has the largest society in London. The Students' Missionary movement originated in the Episcopal church. The church also gave to the world the Young Men's Christian Association, with all its wonderful power for good.

**Why Do Episcopalians Very Rarely Join Other Religious Bodies?**  
 Because the Church supplies to a soul all it needs, and all that any religious body can give. The ministry of clergy of Apostolic Ordination, a beautiful Liturgy, the product of the piety of the ages, properly administered Sacraments, a sincere and high type of piety, faithful and well organized Christian work, a body in which every

soul is encouraged to be its best, and do its best—what more can anyone want. What more can any other religious body supply?  
**Besides the Helpful Works Already Mentioned, What Else Has the Episcopal Church Done?**  
 The Episcopal church was the first to build a college, first to found a public library, first to send missionaries to Japan and to Africa, first to work for the negro, first to plan church unity, first to organize a temperance society in any way inclusive. It started the White Cross movement for purity, made the first association to help working men, founded the first orphan's home, made the first organized charity, established the first public school.

**Do Not Forget**—That more than two-thirds of the framers of the Constitution of the United States were Episcopalians, and that two-thirds of those who signed the Declaration of Independence were also Episcopalians; so also were all the chief justices, but two; and that the church stands now as it did then for worship, culture, piety, reverence and faithful service.

John Fluke says, "There were five great men who made this nation. They were Washington, Jefferson, Hamilton, Madison and Marshall." All five were sons of the Episcopal church.

man expedition to Oregon in 1826. The Methodist conference of Oregon will take care of the Jason-Lee expedition to Oregon in 1834; and if Wallace Watts consents, they will have charge of the Whitman expedition.

**Pierce Comes Through**  
 Governor Walter M. Pierce, who is a member of the Union County Chamber of Commerce, was recently solicited for his share of the apportionment of La Grande for the pageant advance fund. The idea is that each member pay one-fourth of his apportionment and reserve the remainder until further call, but the governor, either in a spirit of generosity or misunderstanding, came through with his entire apportionment. Governor Pierce is one of the most ardent boosters for the pageant and will be there with "bells on."

The celebration will unofficially begin on the evening of July 2nd, when a big dance will be staged at Top O' Blue Mountains and the concession's "open season" started. The pageant proper, however, will be held July 3 and 4, according to announcements by Walter E. Meacham, with dances each evening.

**Wonderful Program**  
 The program, as it is now outlined, will be of a nature that will bear little criticism, even from the most excitable cynic. A mammoth parade will be a feature of the pageantry, depicting pioneer life in all its phases. The Cimarron Indians, 700 strong, will add zest to the list of events by staging their annual "potlatch" at the grounds. President Harding's address will, of course, be the prominent item on the program. The program is still uncompleted.

Facilities for caring for the vast crowd to attend are quite sufficient. Those who wish to camp out at Top O' Blue Mountains, those who want to take "pot luck" for a day or so, and those who come in cars, on foot, on horseback, or by airplane, will all find plenty of room. A program, to be issued beforehand, will give the visitor every bit of information regarding the pageant and the grounds that he desires. Nearly 200 law enforcement officials will be on the scene to prevent crime. Pioneer exhibitions will be many. And the sanitation and water is to be absolutely satisfactory.

**President's Itinerary**  
 President Harding's itinerary on his western trip, as announced in the Evening Observer yesterday, is as follows:  
 The addresses enroute to the coast

will be made in cities on dates as follows:  
 St. Louis, June 21, evening; Kansas City, June 22, evening; Hutchinson, Kan., June 23, afternoon; Denver, June 25, morning; Cheyenne, Wyo., June 25, afternoon; Salt Lake, June 26, evening; Pocatello, Ida., June 28, morning; Idaho Falls, Ida., June 28, afternoon; Butte, Mont., June 29, morning; Helena, Mont., June 29, evening; Spokane, Wash., July 2, evening; Meacham, Ore., July 3, Portland, Ore., July 4, afternoon, and Tacoma, July 5, morning.  
 Returning from Alaska, the president will speak at Vancouver, B. C., July 26, evening; Seattle, July 27, evening; San Francisco, July 31, evening; Los Angeles, August 1, evening and San Diego, August 4, afternoon.

Announcement also was made that on the trip to the coast the president would make brief visits to Zion and Yellowstone national parks and on the trip down the Pacific coast would stop at Yosemite national park. The address at Meacham, Ore., will be in connection with the Oregon trail anniversary celebration.
